3. Barriers to future attainment (<i>for pupils eligible for PP. including high ability</i>)
In-school barriers (<i>issues to be addressed in school e.g. poor oral language skills</i>)
<p>There is a low performing Year group taking Key Stage 2 SATS in 2018. These children have been very well supported throughout Key Stage 2.</p> <p>Some of the Pupil Premium children are also SEN which adds an additional challenge to securing good progress for them.</p> <p>The mental health, well-being and behaviour of pupils may affect their performance.</p>
External Barriers (<i>issues which require actions outside of school including attendance</i>)
<p>Attendance is an issue that needs to be closely monitored for a PP few pupils in each school.</p> <p>Pupils come into school with poor speech and language skills.</p> <p>There is a higher take up of places at independent Nurseries from the age of 2 years and they tend to stay there until they reach Reception Class age. Evidence shows that these pupils perform less well in EYFS than our school nursery pupils.</p> <p>There is a very high percentage of EAL children at the school. Many come with no English language.</p> <p>It is difficult to identify whether some EAL children also have Special Educational Needs in the first few terms.</p> <p>There is a higher take up of places at independent Nurseries from the age of 2 years and they tend to stay there until they reach Reception Class age. Evidence shows that these pupils perform less well in EYFS than our school nursery pupils.</p>
