<p>Watch phonics lesson 38 looking at the /ue/ sound.</p> <p>Make a list of rhyming /ue/ words.</p> <p>Can you write 2 silly sentences using some of your /ue/ words?</p> <p>Read the text on page 2. How many /ue/ words can you find?</p> <p>Can you segment and blend them all to read them?</p> <p>Handwriting</p> <p>See page 3 for today's handwriting. (The poem on page 3 is for the English lesson)</p>	<p>We are going to begin to write our own poetry over the next few days .</p> <p>Practise telling the poem we looked at yesterday (copy on page 3)—remember to use your actions to help you.</p> <p>Today we are going to collect some ideas that we can use later for writing our own version of this poem. What can you hear in the dark or at night? You might want to actually complete this task at bedtime, either by lying in your bed and listening for a while, or by going out for a walk (wearing your reflective clothing so you are safe of course) or standing in your garden. You can write a list or you can draw pictures of all the things you can hear, or think you can hear.</p> <p>See if you can sound out (verbally) the names of the things you can hear.</p> <p>Pick your three favourites ready for tomorrow.</p>	<p>There is a video here for today—please watch 'Number bonds to 10 '.</p> <p>There are some questions to complete on page 3.</p> <p>Have a go at making your own board for this game. To play, roll a dice, or pick a number card to find how many spaces to move along the board. When you land on a space say the number that goes with the number you have landed on to make 10.</p> <div data-bbox="1189 1038 1487 1273" style="border: 1px solid black; padding: 5px; margin: 10px auto; width: fit-content;"> </div> <p style="text-align: center;">Maths Board</p> <p>Feeling wobbly: Side A, Number 7</p> <p>Feeling confident: Side B, Number 10</p>	<p>We have thought about different technologies that we have around our home that are powered by electricity and today we are going to focus on technologies that give us light.</p> <p>Watch this video of different light sources—how many different ones can you spot?</p> <p>How many of these use some form of electricity?</p> <p>How many use a bulb? In our story Laszlo is taken to the drawer of bulbs by the dark because he needs a new one for his room, but who invented the light bulb? How did they do it? Can you find out?</p> <p>We have been learning about significant individuals, and what it means to be significant. We decided that to be significant you had to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> --change the life of someone for better or worse --do something that changed history, for better or worse <p>Do you think the inventor of the lightbulb was a significant person? Why?</p>



I think I can.


And I think I can hear


