Daily Phonics

Today we are recapping our new sounds and practicing using them. This week we have learned: /ar/ or/ and /ur/. Remind yourselves of the caption actions (page 2) for each sound then try to write the words using the phoneme frames on page 2 and 3. Remember to segment each sound, count the sounds and find the digraph before writing.

Activities: Here are 3 challenges for you for today.

Challenge 1: See if you can learn the days of the week song we heard in our zoom on Tuesday (clip attached to email) to the tune of the Addams family. Which is your favourite day of the week? Why? Which day do you least enjoy? Why? Can you order the days of the week? What day is it today? What day is it tomorrow? Can you make yourself a calendar like the one pictured on page 4 and use your day cards each day to fill it in? You could explore and add the date and months too.

Challenge 2: We have been thinking a lot about animals that are nocturnal, that are awake at night, but at this time of year another group of animals have begun to do something very different, it only happens in winter, some animals are hibernating. Do you know what that means? Watch this [video about hedgehogs](#). You could also watch this clip from [Sarah and Duck](#) too. Can you find out about an animal that hibernates and write a sentence or two to tell someone about them? Have a go at this [quiz](#) to see what you know.

Challenge 3: Maths challenge! Listen to the maths sound file and follow the instructions. Have some paper ready to practice writing down the numerals. You will need to pause the audio as you go along.

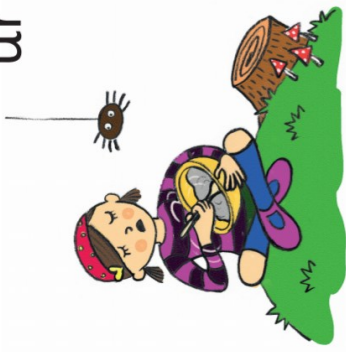

Action: Pretend to tear a piece of material.

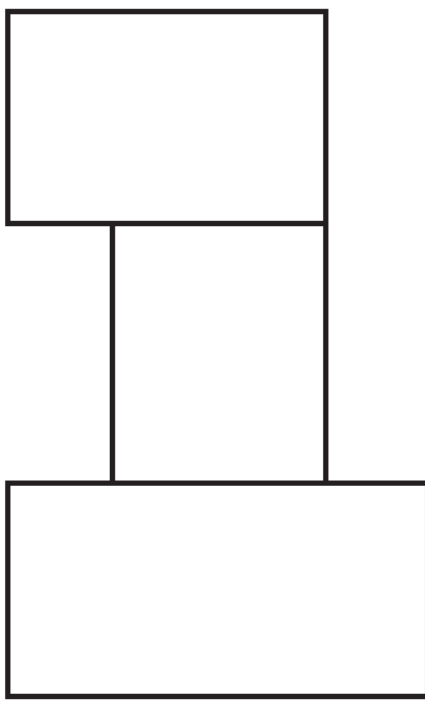
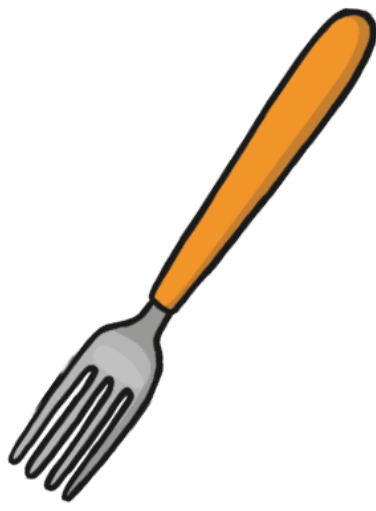
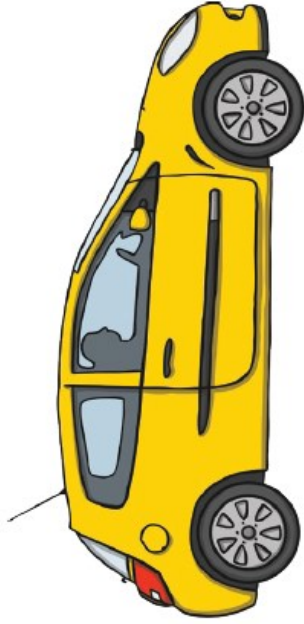
