

Select ow.</p> <p>You have to read the word on the acorn and decide which tree it belongs in to make the sound match.</p>  <p>See page 2 for today's handwriting.</p>	<p>Read the letter on page 2.</p> <p>Then look at the map on page 3</p> <p>Talk about what you can see:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">o What can you spot?o What have they drawn?o Where do you think Anna and Crocodile intend to go?o What makes you think that?o Does this remind you of anything you know in real life or stories? <p>See if you have any adventure stories at home, or watch the two below—read them and see what planning (or lack of planning) the main characters had for their quests.</p> <p>Emily Brown and the Elephant Emergency Lila and the Secret of Rain</p>	<p>Today we are going to explore counting in 5s again. Thank you for your letters about hunting for gold. We have thought about all of the advice you have given us and for our plan to hunt for gold.

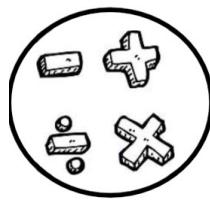
You might be right, maybe we do need to plan this properly, especially if there might be pirates about. We like the idea of taking a bag to collect all the gold.

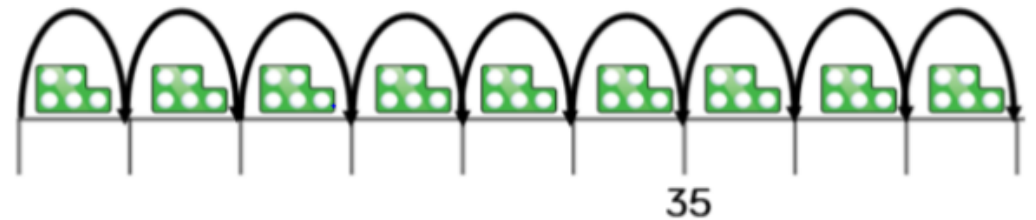
