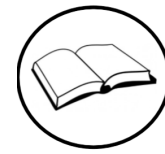

<p>Miss Howes would like you to watch Lesson 55 which re-caps sounds that we have been learning over the last 2 weeks.</p> <p>Have a go at the task on page 2 to practice. Write these words in your handwriting book as your handwriting practice for today too.</p>	<p>Watch the Story of Chinese New Year. If you have any of the animals from the story, collect them up and use them to retell the story, if not use the cards on page 3 to help. What order did the animals cross in? Who came first, second, third, etc.</p> <p>Draw a story map of the story showing what happened and the order that the animals crossed in. Label the animals with the names of the ordinal numbers (first, second etc) using the word card on page 2.</p> <p>(Animals and their order: Rat, Ox, Tiger, Rabbit, Dragon, Snake, Horse, Goat, Monkey, Rooster, Dog, and Pig)</p>	<p>Warm up—play fastest finger first with your 50 grid on page 4—hands behind your back as someone says a number, first person to put their finger on it wins.</p> <p>Watch the first One More One Less video (top row on left).</p> <p>Today you will need your own tens and ones sets for example straws or sticks to represent the tens and peas or beads to represent the ones (see page 4 for some ideas).</p> <p>Pick a number from the 50 grid and make it with your tens and ones (examples on page 4). Talk about how many tens and ones you have used to make the number.</p> <p>Now add one more ‘one’. What number have you made now?</p> <p>Return to the original number. Now take away a ‘one’. What number have you got now?</p> <div style="border: 1px dashed black; padding: 5px; text-align: center;"> <p>Maths Board</p> <p>Feeling wobbly: Side A, Number 2 Feeling confident: Side B, Number 12</p> </div>	<p>Look on a map or a globe and find where China is.</p> <p>Can you find out how far it is from England to China?</p> <p>Chinese New Year is also celebrated in many other places around the world: Singapore, Indonesia and the Philippines are just a few of them. Can you find these places on your map or globe?</p> <p>Can you find out: The capital city of China The name/s of languages spoken One other interesting fact about China</p> <p>In China the language spoken is written in different characters to the letters we use. Look in your pack and find your name written in Chinese symbols. Have a go at writing it out for yourself.</p>
