Daily Phonics

Play fastest finger first, listen to the sound file and see if you can find the sounds.

Spend some time going over the sounds you find hardest to remember at the moment.

Attached to the email is a domino game, cut all the domino cards out and find the one which says 'Go' read the sentence that is attached to the other half of the card and match the picture to it, then read the next sentence and continue until you reach 'stop'.

Activities: Here are 4 challenges for you for today.

Challenge 1: At Chinese New Year children are given red envelopes containing money. Your task today is to design and make a red envelope. In your pack there is some red paper that you can use to make your final design. How will you join the sides together? What shape works best for an envelope? Can you paint or draw your name onto the front of your envelope in Chinese characters?

Challenge 2: With an adult, look at some coins and see if you can see any numbers on them. What numbers can you see? What shape are the coins? What colours are they? Can you find some pennies and count how much money you have?

Challenge 3: One of the colours often seen during Chinese New Year is red. Make a list of words that rhyme with the word red, e.g. bed. See how many you can write down. Remember to use your phonics fingers to sound them all out, and check your letter mat for how to write the letters if you aren't sure.

Challenge 4: Fireworks are often seen during Chinese New Year. Paint or draw a firework picture. You could use crayons, pens, paint or glitter and glue. What colours and shapes do your fireworks make?
