This week in Aslacton

Here is a snapshot of our learning this week: Owls have been learning about pirates and spent a day dressed as pirates, solving pirate codes, searching for treasure and making treasure maps. We have also been thinking about working together as a team. Kestrels have had a busy week learning about and measuring the different types of angles in maths. In English we have finished reading The Wild Robot and have discussed our thoughts and feelings about the story; picking out some of our favourite moments and interesting vocabulary that we have learnt. We have written in role as main character Roz as she says farewell to her island home and animal friends. In our topic lessons we have continued working hard on our Jane Goodall booklets which are looking fantastic! Eagles have had fun this week exploring angles in maths. We can estimate, measure and draw angles to 360 degrees. We have calculated missing angles on a straight line and in a range of triangles. We have also explored angles in famous pieces of art. In English, we have created interesting information fact-files about tardigrades, linking to our core-story thriller Crater Lake. In Art, Eagles have created stunning paintings based on Georgia O'Keeffe's 1928 work 'Oriental Poppies'.
